Erasing Family follows children and young adults from different countries fighting to reunite their broken families. Part emotional roller-coaster, part investigative expose, *Erasing Family* follows the money to expose why loving moms and dads are erased from their kid´s lives by divorce courts.

Dysfunctional family dynamics collide with a system that systematically rips families apart for financial gain. The result: **22 million parents** in the U.S. alone are cut off from their children after divorce or separation.

Erasing Family will shine a light on the most helpless victims of family courts: children.

Erasing Family is the first documentary designed to encourage young adults to reunite with their #erased families.



"I´d say to my sister, our dad is not a monster. He is nothing like we were told he was."


"My dream is to live a week with my mom, a week with my dad, and have my brother with me." *"Some families have photos and memories. I have court documents."*

Ashlynn

Her father was hounded by the system which took his money and his kids. At 18, Ashlynn reunites with her father and tries to reverse the adoption that has made them legal strangers. But her sister now shuns them both.

Can this high school dropout reunite her family, and become a voice for a generation of erased children?



Lisa Rose

yearns for her brother who's been brainwashed against their mother by their father. A million dollars was spent in family court, but with a tragic result: her brother runs away to England at 16. Lisa Rose messages him, but he responds "Until you reject mom, I can't talk to you."

She sets out to find him and confront the judge who let this happen. But will the trip just result in further heartbreak?



Yenni

lives in a rundown home with her dad, both cut off from her younger brother and sister by their mother. When she brings birthday gifts for her siblings, their mom screams, "I'll call the cops on you!" Yenni and her dad have spent years in the courts fighting for visits.

Driven to depression by the legal hurdles, is Yenni's last hope a class action law suit?



In whose best interest?

The first half of the film will investigate the legal systems that let this happen, and follow the money trail that subverts justice for these children.

The girls' investigation reveals false accusations, perjury and forgery in their cases.

The legal system turns family conflict into profit, hounding parents all the way to debtors' prison and sometimes to murder or suicide.



The US government spends billions on child support enforcement and almost nothing on visitation enforcement.

Meanwhile, the divorce industry grows. . . 25 times the revenue of Starbucks.

Public Health Crisis

No parent is perfect. But in the absence of abuse or neglect, children have a right to both parents.

The fallout is passed from generation to generation. Children denied a relationship with a parent still struggle as adults:


70% suffer from depression
35% develop problems with drugs and alcohol
50% are alienated from their own children

A generation of traumatized children.

A preventable public health crisis.

Ignored because it's considered a normal part of divorce for children to lose contact with a parent.

From Trauma to Hope



Can the girls reunite their families and get them on the road to healing? The film's second half presents the emotional fallout for all involved.

After confrontation and, finally, reunification, the film explores alternatives to help families avoid this trauma:

Exploring programs that provide alternatives to adversarial family courts.

Using mediation to reduce conflict.

Shared parenting legislation to reduce conflict and ensure that kids have equal access to all their family.



Erasing Family is designed to encourage young adults to reunite with their **#erased** families by explaining why this happened and how to heal.

Urgency to finish in 2018



- 73% of millennials support shared parenting
- In 2018, almost half of U.S. states have legislation pending supporting shared parenting.

But in the last 10 years, similar bills have been blocked due to lobbying by those who have financial incentives in the adversarial system.

Erasing Family will create momentum for legislative change while at the same time encouraging kids to reunite with their families by giving them a road map to healing.

Previous Film: Erasing Dad



The *Erasing Family* team is the same behind **Erasing Dad** (**Borrando a Papá**, Argentina 2014), which made family bond obstruction front page news, and drove legislative and court reform in Argentina. It combined the story of fathers fighting to see their children with the testimony of professionals who confessed to keeping families apart in the name of profit.

Impact of Erasing Dad

The film was censored in Argentina.

But passionate advocates privately distributed the film via DVDs and the internet.

The media covered the story and thousands of families began to speak out.

They knew they were not alone.

The impact was huge and spread beyond Argentina all over Latin America.



Thanks to the film, the public now sees fathers separated from their children as victims of institutional violence.

Most importantly, the film reunited families due to court decisions, and young people were inspired to reconnect with their parents.

Argentina enacted joint custody legislation after the film's release.

Production Details

Production is approximately 40% complete, with shoots planned in 21 locations by early 2018. It is a complex international shoot with a lean crew, ready to travel as circumstances, and our characters' stories, require.

We are shooting on 4K cameras with the best documentary crews. All stories will be fact checked, and a commitment to the highest journalistic standards.

25 experts have been filmed at the International Shared Parenting Conference in Boston, 2017, in addition to shoots with our protagonists.



We will also deliver a digital copy to every state and federal politician and family court worker, lawyer and judge.

Documentaries Creating Change



The ARMOR Of LIGHT AFILM BY ABIGAIL E. DISNE

Bullying declined from 24% to 14% of US school children being victims. Bullying is viewed as a public health crisis in great part due to "Bully".

- Film seen by 3.2 million children
- Educator's Toolkit reached over 2 million
- 88% agree that the film & training helped create a safer classroom environment

Blackfish aired on CNN and brought the "fringe" issue of animal rights to national attention. "The Blackfish Effect" caused an 84% drop in SeaWorld profits.

- SeaWorld halted its orca breeding program
- U.S. Congress studied the impact of captivity on orcas

Sparked gun control dialogue in evangelical churches. Sermons and bible study reached an audience normally opposed to this issue.



Erasing Family is expected to cost \$735,000 to produce plus funding for the impact campaign. We need \$145,000 by December 2017 to finish filming, then \$350,000 by July 2018 for the impact campaign.

We have **secured \$200,000** in a grant from the Canadian Association for Equality and are awaiting a **\$200,000** grant for post-production from the Argentine film board.

We are also drawing on \$100,000 so far in small donations through a very successful crowdfunding campaign, including 22 donations of \$1000 apiece.

But we need the bulk of our funding by late 2017 to meet our goal of using the film in 2018 to push legislation that supports shared parenting.

Our ideal partners are individuals & Foundations committed to promoting healthier families.
